How Singing, Dancing, and Tapping Your Feet Can Build Language Skills

Researchers at Vanderbilt University gave 25 typically developing six-year-olds two tests, one measuring grammar skills and the other measuring music skills. They found that those who did well on one test also did well on the other, regardless of socioeconomic background or IQ. This suggests that children who can detect rhythmic variations in music may have an easier time putting sentences together.
