Other Questions:

- If a teacher is interested in finding information about employment with the TNVA, is there
 information posted somewhere online or who is the person they should contact?

 <u>Answer</u>: Please visit <u>K12.com/careers</u> for job openings.
- 2. If a parent wants to make a referral for an evaluation for a special education evaluation, who is it that they would need to submit that request to?

<u>Answer</u>: Parents can send the request in writing to their assigned teacher who will then forward the document to the special education department.

3. If a parent is having difficulty getting an IEP scheduled through TNVA, or having an issue that is not being resolved in a timely fashion for their special needs child, what procedural safeguards are there in place for them?

<u>Answer</u>: We have a process in place that is outlined in our parent handbook that parents can follow to resolve any issues.

4. If a student is expelled from their home school in TN, is it true that there are other online virtual schools that are available that do enroll students from other states, that a student in this type of situation might be able to benefit from?

<u>Answer</u>: There are several online education options out there. Each has its own requirements, possibly including a tuition fee that would need to be researched carefully by the parent.

5. Aren't some of these out-of-state virtual schools free of charge?

Answer: Not that we are aware of – although, research by parent is necessary.

- 6. Does k12.com, which provides the structure of services for TNVA, have a link to other virtual schools in the U.S. posted on their website, so people can contact those schools if they are interested in finding out about enrollment requirements and whether or not they admit out-of-state students, and whether they charge a fee for enrollment in an out-of-state school served by k12.com?
 Answer: K12.com contains information about all available options through K12. Other schools and options can be found using an internet search engine. Find a School and Enroll
- 7. If a parent has a student who is expelled from their homeschool, can that parent enroll their student in k12.com for a fee, to allow their child to continue with their education?

 Answer: Yes, there are independent homeschool curriculum options through K12.
- 8. Does k12.com serve students with IEP's? / Would k12.com be considered to be a private school placement?

<u>Answer</u>: If families purchase curriculum directly through K12.com does not include special education support services.
