Department of Disability and Aging Partners with Trevecca Nazarene University to Launch Academic Behavioral Learning Program for Teachers

The Department of Disability and Aging (DDA) has partnered with Trevecca Nazarene University to launch the Academic and Behavioral Learning Certificate (ABLC) Program — a free, 12-week professional development course designed for licensed TN teachers.

This program provides 90 professional development hours and equips educators with tools to create inclusive classrooms and support students with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Teachers will explore best practices in co-teaching, understanding IEPs, and strengthening classroom engagement and socialemotional learning.

"By providing free, high-quality training for our teachers, we are enhancing their ability to meet the diverse needs of students and helping to create a more inclusive education system in Tennessee," said DDA Commissioner Brad Turner.

At TNSTEP, we celebrate this partnership as another step toward a future where every student, regardless of ability, will learn and thrive.


